




How to Create an Instagram Story


<p>Set the width to 1080, the height to 1920, and the resolution to 300.</p>	
<p>OPTIONAL: Set the orientation to landscape/square mode in lieu of manually setting the dimension values.</p>	
<p>Once you're finished, select the 'Create' button.</p>	

Place an image (preferably a vertical one) into your project.




Adjust the scale and position of the image to fit your project.




OPTIONAL (but recommended): Select the Text tool and add text to your image in a position that's visible but within Instagram's borderlines.



OPTIONAL (but recommended): Under the Properties panel, customize the text font, color, and size.



OPTIONAL: Adjust the blending mode to add a color variation to the image (see [How to Overlay Other Images Over Another Image in Photoshop](#)).



Add a logo into the image and position it in or near the center of your image.



Make any further customizations depending on if you need anything added.

Export your image to use as an Instagram story (see [How to Export an Image in Photoshop](#)).
